

W.A. Veteran Vehicle Muster, 4-5th November 2023.

This was a jointly conducted event, by the Veteran & Classic Car Club of W.A. and the Indian Harley Club, for Veteran Vehicles (Pre 1919). I attended the Saturday start at Donnybrook, as a non-participant, not having a veteran vehicle, but to cover proceedings on behalf of the IHC.

A cool morning presented but warmed up as the day progressed. My sources told me that there were 25 motorcycles and 16 cars registered for the rally. The oldest (running) car was a 1907 Rover and oldest bike was a 1903 Minerva/Romania (Belgium manufacturer). Although, coorganiser Andrew, brought along his 1898 De Deon (France) motor tricycle, as a non-running display.

Of note was a 1908 Clément-Talbot (UK) van, decked out in red Arnott's Biscuit livery. Also, a 1910 Deasy (UK), with its owners looking the part, attired in period Edwardian costume, were cars that caught the eye. Co-organiser Michael conducted the rider/driver briefing and then it was start your engines and away.

At this point, I was going to head back home, having completed my club. duties, but Andrew and Sally kindly offered me a ride, over the pre-lunch leg of the course, in their 1913 Napier

(UK). This was a first for me, as the oldest car I had ridden into date, was our family FJ Holden, back in the early 1960s. I climbed in the back seat with Albany resident Nick (94 years young). Nick and I were each handed a paddle (hand shaped), mine was red and Nick had a white one. We were instructed that on command from Andrew upon approaching a turn, one of us was to wave our paddle outside the car (no windows either), signifying our intention to turn. Quite effective really.

Unfortunately, I noticed the 1903 Minerva/Romania on the side of the road, just before Capel, requiring backup support. The backup trailer already had its first customer by then, being the Abington King Dick V Twin or was it The Lewis V Twin, not sure which, as I didn't get time to get a good look at it, as we sped past in the Napier.

Our first stop was for morning tea, kindly hosted by and at Murray Cooper's farm in the Elgin area. Mick was there with the urn nice and hot, for a cuppa. Murray has an amazing collection of fuel bowsers and automotive paraphernalia, well worth a look, but by invitation only.

TALES FROM THE SHED - CLIMBING A HILL IN ALBANY By Dan Talbot

After a year off, the Albany Vintage and Classic Motorcycle Weekend has returned in a dazzle of chromium and the tantalising whiff of Castrol R in the air around the port town. Referred to genetically as the 'Albany Hill Climb,' the event is more than motorcycles tearing off up Mount Clarence.

The weekend kicks off with a Saturday morning motorcycle display on Stirling Terrace in the heart of Albany. Shortly after midday on Saturday a rally, taking in the roads and sights of Albany, kicks off for some two hours before finishing at the Rifle Club for afternoon tea. Then, on Sunday we race.

In truth, we don't actually race, that's an exaggeration to add flare to this report. The event is in fact run on regularity and this year proved again that a 'steady as she goes' approach will increase one's chances of leaving with the silverware. Sure, there is a start line and the commentator keeps referring to Marine Drive 'as the track' but cresting the finish line too soon or too late will result in the rider being sent packing. That said, you would have to be travelling pretty hard to go under the 40-second limit.

The event has a limit of 100 riders who are divided into three groups. This year around ninety competitors made it. When a group is called, thirty-odd riders are corralled into the starting chute, eventually being sorted into pairs as you inch forward. When you get to the start line proper, each bike is held in place by a wooden block placed against the rear wheel. This prevents the chocks the machine and allows you to rev the engine and act like an actual motorcycle racer without having to worry about rolling backwards down the incline.

You can get a good look at competitors leaving the start line from within the chute, seeing who brakes traction, who makes the most noise and who botches the start. Scores of spectators line each side of the road so my greatest fear is making a hash of the start. My second-greatest fear is my wife would do the same – I need not have worried, out of five starts, Catherine got her little 650 Triumph away cleanly every time.

This year I was lined up with fellow IHC member Kenny Britza. When we were teenagers, Britz and I used to race each other in motocross at the Scrublands Park circuit. In those days, you started with your left hand on your helmet until the flag dropped before jamming your bike in gear and racing towards the first turn. On our last run up the hill, Britz and I reenacted our seventies-something starting procedure. Sure, we looked like a couple of clowns but we did amuse ourselves.

The 'track' consists 1.1 kilometres up Mount Clarence on Marine Drive. There's a left-hand bend, followed by two right handers, all of which can be taken at a pretty good speed. I was on the right side of the road and, out of five different runs at the hill, I had five different lines into that confounded left-hand bend. It was just wrong. There was both rough and smooth patches, a dead lizard on one or two runs and I was half expecting a car to come the other way, despite the roads being closed. Out of turn one and laying on the power saw my bike jump out of third a couple of times, which is something that I've learned to live with after

10,000 miles on my bike. This had me choosing fourth gear sooner than I might otherwise have done. The bike never jumps out of fourth so I can concentrate on negotiating the next two right-handers at full tilt, gathering speed as I go.

After we cross the finish line, all competitors must wait at the top of the hill until escorted down by a marshal. This allows plenty of time for banter and to allow or vital signs to return to normal levels.

I highly recommend this event!


