

PRESIDENTS REPORT

Dan welcomed three members who had travelled from Manjimup to be at the meeting. They are John Rooney, Eric Austin, and Greg Smithers, Great to see them make the effort to attend.

He mentioned the work that was being undertaken inside the clubroom. A bar is being constructed in the corner.

Also advised the meeting that the Motor Complex committee had undertaken some planning submission work and once completed members will be advised and asked for comment.

He raised the importance of filling out an impromptu ride whenever using 404 machines outside of club ride or mechanic tests. If you ride a machine and especially if you are involved in accident on 404 outside of these two sanctioned criteria there is no insurance, and you will be riding an unregistered machine. Please complete them, impromptu ride form, they are for your protection.

The Committee has looked at whether we should repeal the need to sign the indemnity form prior to each of our runs. Looking at an alternative way by signing a blanket form of a waiver/ Indemnity when your join and each time you renew your membership. Once research has been conducted, we will put it to the membership.

The committee has suggested that a \$1000 donation be made to the BMCC to assist in the purchase of reticulation so that we will have lawn out the front of the club room for our two-day rally. If agreed we will ask them to confirm the dates of the installation so that we can assist wth a working bee to complete the task.

I raise a motion that, "The Indian Harley Club (Bunbury) Inc., donates \$1000 to the Bunbury Motorcycle Club to assist with the purchase of reticulation for instillation in the lawn at the front of the Clubrooms."

GENERAL BUSSINESS

John Rooney announced that he had some riding boots for sale if anyone wished to purchase them. He also asked that Eric and Greg, members from Manjimup be allowed to introduce themselves.

Eric Austin introduced himself to the members present and stated that although he does not have any older bikes, he does have an 1985 BMW. He holds an interest in older bikes and is looking to get one.

Greg Smithers also introduced himself to the members stating he has a shed full of bikes, mainly motorcross. Also has a 350 Gold Star BSA, 500 Matchless and is semi-retired.

Andrew Repton then gave the meeting an overview of the 1898 De Dion tricycle machine that he had brought to the meeting for display. All the machine bar the coil was original. He believes that this is the oldest motorised vehicle in Australia.

Andrew gave an excellent account of the working of the machine. As I am unable to give him justice via my note taking, I have cut and pasted the below for the members benefit.

"De Dion Bouton motor tricycle, by the Motor Manufacturing Co. Coventry, 1898. This tricycle is a copy of the French machines which embodied improvements patented by Count Albert De Dion and Charles Bouton in 1895. A vertical single-cylinder air-cooled engine is mounted behind the rear axle which it drives through spur gearing.



This motor tricycle was designed by two Frenchman, Count Albert De Dion and Charles Bouton. Quite a number were built and one of them ran in the famous 1899 Paris to Bordeaux race at an average speed of 28 miles an hour.

Quite a lot of physical effort was needed to pedal-start these tricycles, but once going well on a reasonably flat road they were capable of cruising at a speed of about 20 miles an hour, which was quite fast for a nineteenth-century road vehicle. Cornering a motor tricycle necessitated some skill, particularly on the bad road surfaces of the period, but the ability to manoeuvre was assisted by the differential gear located in the tricycle's rear axle. No clutch was provided.

Following the invention by Gottlieb Daimler in 1885 of the surface vaporisers for supplying an ignitable air-petrol mixture, various specialised types were evolved for both cars and motorcycles. The example shown is one of the best known of this period and was used extensively on the De Dion motor tricycle.

The sheet metal petrol container has an air inlet tube with a slidable horizontal baffle by means of which the incoming air, induced by the suction of the engine, is directed over the surface of the petrol. The resulting air-petrol vapour flows through the cylindrical mixing chamber and is controlled by a barrel throttle; a second barrel throttle admits extra air. The mixing chamber is connected to the inlet port of the engine by a pipe.

A small pipe connecting with the exhaust pipe passes through the petrol in the container to assist vaporisation. A float with a long wire indicator shows the quantity of petrol in the container."



1926/27 OVERLANDERS TOUR BY THE HARLEY CLUB OF WA

The story of this epic trip on unmade roads in 1926/27 is a key piece of WA motorcycling history which needs to be told and preserved. Murray Barnard (Editor of the VMCC) has spent thousands of hours researching the original Tour and working from original handwritten diaries to authentically capture the details of this story.

This is enhanced with many original black and white and colourised photos of the Tour as it crossed from Perth to Sydney on mostly unmade roads. Only a year later Norm Cunningham and Ted Cracknell, who did the earlier trip in 1926/27, did a Record Run across the same ground, riding 24 hours a day, in an attempt to reduce the official time to cross Australia.

Then in 1990 a Re-enactment of the Tour was done by members of the VMCC (old people on 25 old bikes).



The final product of Murray's research (covering the original Tour, the Record Run and the 1990 Re-enactment) will be a 300 page hard copy book which will be an interesting read. It is planned to print only a limited number of copies in January 2024 and they will cost \$60 each.

DOUG'S WET AND WILD RIDE HOME.

I thought I had left the King of Darkness, Joe Lucas behind when buying a new model Triumph Bonneville T100, unfortunately Tony Bloor was good in replicating the Triumphs of old, in poor headlights low and high beam.

I arrived safely at home totally drenched and cold, dogs baying for their dinner and needing a hot shower, priorities first, out with the shammy and wipe of the excess water from the painted surfaces and engine covers of my bike. Dogs fed, I'm showered, and the house is festooned in wet soaking clothes, wet weather suite and riding gear.

The house inside looks like a party at Christmas time. The promising aspect of the ride is the Triumph embossed leather look panniers which kept everything inside dry, now to make a rain suit from the same material.

A rider not smart enough to stop and take shelter, but so excited about the ride. Keep the shiny side up and safe riding.
