



11-11-2020





President's Report for General Meeting 10 Nov 2020

I have a few things to report from Committee:

1. Member Numbers. To help keep count of actual members and to facilitate accurate reporting of concessional registrations, every full member will have a unique number. This only affects Family memberships where now, the primary member will keep their original number, spouses/partners will have the suffix A added, and children will be allocated letters from B onwards. As an example my number is 101, my wife's number is now 101A.
2. COVID Compliance. Thanks to Ryan Loverock for his report. Although we can expect changes as the WA border restrictions are relaxed, for now we continue as before. We still cannot have shared refreshments after a meeting where we touch the same utensils, taps, cups etc. Catered events can still happen as long as an approved person serves the refreshments in a Covid compliant way.
