BSA C10L Restoration Project

Hi all - into the second month of my Resto and progress has been made. I was able to get a Block of wood between the crank

housing and the base of the barrel, and with the help of some heat in the right places and a bit o f perseverance, I managed to slowly free the piston from the barrel. e n d e d breaking the top fin of the

barrel. That's ok, it can be welded with a nickel cast iron welding rod. It looks like I will be chasing up an over size piston and a rebore. Any help regarding chasing up a piston or even a matching barrel would be greatly appreciated.

Some interesting reading of the History of the BSA C10-L below.

The 1954 C10L and it is a charming piece of equipment within its limitations. Plunger

suspension, 10hp side valve engine and a frame derived from the Bantam stable (similar to the D3 Bantam)

They were a "parts bin" bike produced from end of line components. When they were built overhead valve engines were becoming the new thing, swing arm suspension was coming into the market and telescopic forks

> with dampers were expected. So for a few years BSA threw C10L's out the door with the last plunger frames, the last of the side valve engines and simple spring forks from the Bantams. They are a budget bike and were sold that way. A bike for a bloke to ride to work and back.






They cruise at 40mph but with 5 inch brakes each end and a flexible frame designed for a 125cc Bantam it can be exciting. It will actually do 60mph but you don't want to be going there. It's pretty hairy.

On the up side, side valve engines are way cool, there are plenty of parts from the bigger C10/C11 and Bantam range that cross over so parts are reasonably easy to find and they are a very easy bike to work on.

A good first bike for an intro to Brit bikes. Like a big lawn mower really.

The hard to find parts unique to the bike are the tool box, tank, frame and pillion seat.

Almost everything else crosses over to another BSA, either the Bantams or the other C range 250's.



They are reasonably rare because most of them have been killed through use and lack of performance but not worth big money. Save it if you can. 1956 was the last year they made them.

The Schizophrenic Bantam

It's not that I am a Bantam fan, it's just that they always seem to be around when strange things happen. Those of you who read my story last month will remember that I had a 125cc Bantam and my mate had a 150cc model. As well as the larger engine, his had a battery lighting system and improved forks and suspension. Anyway, it was a big

improvement on mine. My D1 125 had direct lighting, which meant that the faster you went the brighter the lights became. Brighter in this context still means dim. Just not quite as dim as when you are going slower. The other thing you learn is not to change from dip to main beam unless you slow down first. If travelling at anything over about 30 MPH changing from dip to main beam will

blow the rear light globe. So, not the best electrical system. My mates 150 however was a big improvement. with battery lighting charged by a Wipac alternator. The ignition, however, continued to be provided by the coils and contact breaker incorporated in the Wipac unit. This did have the advantage that the bike would still start and run even if the battery was flat. One day, however, the ignition part stopped working and his bike would not start. After much testing it was discovered that the windings that provided power to the ignition had failed, although the windings that charged the battery for the lighting still worked OK. Being resourceful types, we figured that if we were to fit an external ignition coil powered by the battery

and connected it via the contact breaker points in the Wipac unit it ought to work. So, after rummaging around, a suitable ignition coil was found and wired up to the existing battery and points. And, to much surprise, it worked perfectly. Well, let's just say almost perfectly. There was just this one small problem. Being a two stroke,



provided the piston moves up and down the engine will run - in either direction! If you try to make a four stroke motor run backwards it will suck air in the exhaust and blow it out the carburettor so it won't work. But a two stroke will. Now, normally, with the magneto type ignition if you try to spin the engine backwards the windings are not aligned with the magnets when the points open so no spark and the engine won't run. But, running off the battery, it will produce a nice spark and start the engine going the wrong way. Now, this was still a rare event, as normally one would kick the engine over and it would start in the correct direction. But, occasionally, the engine would fire and

kick back - and keep going! Just something you had to be aware of.

Jacks Hill Transport Cafe was a favourite haunt of us young lads as it was open 24/7 and had a Shell servo there also always open. The cafe had a Juke Box and Pin Ball machines, so it was a popular spot when nothing else was open in the small hours. And so it was that we found ourselves there early one morning. I was riding pillion on my mates 150 for some reason. On leaving we discovered that the bike had a soft front No problem, the Shell servo was tyre. always open, so around the corner we went. When we got there we were confronted by a sign saying that there was now a fee of 1/- to use the air inflator. We thought this was daylight robbery as, after all, air was free wasn't it? So we blew up the tyres, and after checking that the attendant bloke was sitting in his box looking the other way, decided to do a runner. A quick stab of the kickstart and we leapt on the the bike just as the attendant shouted at us. A big rev, drop the clutch and you can guess the rest. We took off backwards across the servo forecourt before landing in a big heap in front of the attendants box. I remember looking up at the attendants face and seeing what I could best describe as a look of stunned amazement. I probably had a similar expression. And then he started laughing. And I swear there was a tear running down his cheek. "Thats OK lads, no need to pay" he said "that was worth much more than 1/-".
