Incoming President's Report & Introduction

Incoming President's Report and Introduction

As I said when I took the seat at the Indian Harley Club AGM, I am honoured to be appointed President. I would also like to acknowledge the terrific work by the outgoing President Mr Michael Rock. Thanks again for your commitment Michael. And thankyou to the IHC membership for placing your trust in me. For those who were not at the AGM, Michael assembled the outgoing committee and publicly thanked them. Again, I would like to thank my fellow committee members, old, new and remaining. We are still chasing some committee members so I offer both a plea for assistance and pledge to help incumbents negotiate the next 12 months. Anyone thinking of becoming the secretary, captain, vice-captain and vice-president are urged to join us in the committee. By way of introduction, I have been a member of the Indian Harley Club for about 13 years. For the first four years I used to attend the meetings with my father, Tom Talbot, who had been a member for many years before that. I look around a meeting and see many people who were friends of Dad. I am also surrounded by people, that as a young man, I saw as local heroes, stars of scrambles and speedway legends. As an adult I now consider many of these people my friends.

Dad first introduced me to classic motorcycling when I was about ten years of age. I watched as he turned a rusty old farm-hack, WLA Harley Davidson into a gleaming gold and black thing of beauty. We trundled all over the South West on that bike with me sitting on a cushion nicked from the loungeroom at home. The cushion would slide around on the shiny rear guard as I fought for space on the Harley running boards where Dad's feet were firmly planted. My third anchor point was the sprung saddle. Imagine that now, a ten year-old sitting on the rear guard of a 750cc monster, slip-sliding around, gripping for dear life to a bouncing saddle and wearing no helmet: the cops would freak out. How do I know that?

I am a 37-year veteran of WA Police. Don't worry, I have never been a traffic cop so I will leave the intricacies and hard-to-answer questions around the Road Traffic Act to those more experienced with that side of law enforcement than I. These days I am a researcher and, by the end of the year, all being well, I should be a doctor. That means if anyone comes by any harm whilst out on a ride, I will be qualified to enter into a philosophical discussion about the nuances of what went wrong but you will still need to call an ambulance. Speaking of ambulances, I've had a few crashes and have recently signed up for a few more, bear with me.

Despite those early transgressions on a Harley Davidson, and owning no less than four Harleys over the past forty years, I am what could describe as a 'British motorcycle tragic.' That is probably evident from my infrequent missives in this magazine, usually centred around the best (and worst) of British. That said, I now have a nice example of one of the finest motorcycles to come out of Austria – a 500cc KTM dirt-bike. After eight or nine hours riding time I'm still yet to properly crash that motorcycle (which, in some circles would mean I am probably not riding it fast enough). My return to dirt-bikes brings me to a full circle.

In 1975 I joined the Bunbury Motorcycle Club and went racing. Not very well but I did enjoy battering my young self on the Shrublands Park circuit once or twice a month. It was those early days of riding, racing and competing in enduros that shaped my motorcycle world. A world that I love sharing with you.



Constable H.E. Graves in his memoire Who Rides described Lake Perkolilli: surely one of the world's smaller wonders. Imagine a country dense and chocked with that low, grey-green growth, bridle tracks worming though, an occasional lizard the only company. Out of all this the lake suddenly breaks. It is a huge, roughly circular area of clay. At its edge, most unaccountable, all vegetation sharply ends, The land becomes dead. The surface of the clay is utterly flat, glass-like, smooth like a mirror, it painfully reflects the glare of the sun so that the beholden blinks from its sheen.

Little wonder that by the time Graves penned the above words, Lake Perkolilli had enjoyed over a decade and a half as Western Australia's first motor-racing circuit.

Busselton Tortoise Ride


Busselton Tortoise ride - Friday 26th of August.



President's Report – AGM Sept 2022

It is time to reflect on the health of our club as I vacate the chair for a new President.

We celebrated in style last year as we recorded our 50th year as a club and reached a membership milestone of 500 members. Our Member Management system in Wild Apricot today shows a total of 526 members, being 399 Family, 198 Ordinary, 24 Life and 5 Honorary Members.

We have seen the introduction of many new events in the Calendar as increased variety in the types of runs has been well supported. We have also seen a growth in the activities of our satellite groups as both Busselton and Mandurah groups have added new regular runs to the list.

A surprising area of growth in the club is with Veteran riders. The rapid rise in popularity of these pre-1919 motorcycles has caught the attention of many IHC members, and we are now holding our own WA Veteran Muster, likely to become an annual event.

Property Officer's Report

During the year, a small white ant infestation was found in the shed. The shed was given a thorough inspection and then a white ant treatment. The treatment was donated by White Ant Jack Pest Control.

A small amount of rust has been found at the bottom of some wall panels on the south side of the shed. Some form of treatment for this is to be determined and conducted over the summer months.

A recent audit of the contents of the shed showed that there were very few items missing from the previous audit in 2021. The missing items are all low value and easily replaced i.e., 1 x star picket, 2 x Coreflute IHC Event Signs and 6 x shock cord ties used for installing the back and side panels of the club's marquees.

One of the clubs' marquees was destroyed by a localised storm in Manjimup during the WA Veteran Motorcycle Rally last October. A permanent repair of the marquee was abandoned when it was shown that the canopy material had rotted. The rally organising committee purchased/donated an identical marquee to replace the damaged one, which is still in the shed. The frame is being kept for spares, as the frames are identical.

A decision will need to be taken on what to do with canopy, as it is virtually unusable due to the condition of the material. One suggestion would be to remove the panels with the IHC logo and sell or auction them off for shed or man cave banners. The remainder would then be disposed of.

Several items of equipment used during the WA Veteran Motorcycle Rally were donated to the club on completion of the event. These were 2 x 9kg dry powder fire extinguishers, 1 x car roof rotating beacon and 4 x (each) Coreflute No Parking and Rally Entry Signs.

A front wheel clamp motorcycle stand has appeared in the shed, with no indication where it came from. The person who left it there should notify the property officer if it is to be added to the club's equipment list. **Steve Armstrong.**

Treasurers Report

The Audit by RWK Accountancy of the IHC Finances & Bookkeeping has been completed for the year to 31st May 2022. I am pleased to report everything was found to be in order.

Jennie Freeman who did the audit made some suggestions which will make reporting more straightforward, and easier to understand. Although our main money maker, the 2 Day Rally was unfortunately cancelled this year we are still in decent shape.

RWK have increased the fees for their Xero subscription from \$40.00 per month to \$44.25 per month which will come into effect next month. This is an increase over 12 months of \$51.00. The Profit and Loss figures for the year ending 31st of May 2022 was Trading Income of \$36,677.97, Cost of Sales \$1,103.80, Operating Expenses of \$32,384.89, resulting in a Net Profit of \$3,189.28. 

Incoming President's Report and Introduction

For those who were not at the AGM, Michael assembled the outgoing committee and publicly thanked them. Again, I would like to thank my fellow committee members, old, new and remaining. By way of introduction, I have been a member of the Indian Harley Club for about 13 years. For the first four years I used to attend the meetings with my father, Tom Talbot, who had been a member for many years before that. I look around a meeting and see many people who were friends of Dad. I am also surrounded by people, that as a young man, I saw as local heroes, stars of scrambles and speedway legends. As an adult I now consider many of these people my friends.

Dad first introduced me to classic motorcycling when I was about ten years of age. I watched as he turned a rusty old farm-hack, WLA Harley Davidson into a gleaming gold and black thing of beauty. We trundled all over the South West on that bike with me sitting on a cushion nicked from the loungeroom at home.

The cushion would slide around on the shiny rear guard as I fought for space on the Harley running boards where Dad's feet were firmly planted. My third anchor point was the sprung saddle. Imagine that now, a ten year-old sitting on the rear guard of a 750cc monster, slip-sliding around, gripping for dear life to a bouncing saddle and wearing no helmet: the cops would freak out. How do I know that?

I am a 37-year veteran of WA Police. Don't worry, I have never been a traffic cop so I will leave the intricacies and hard-to-answer questions around the Road Traffic Act to those more experienced with that side of law enforcement than I.

These days I am a researcher and, by the end of the year, all being well, I should be a doctor. In 1975 I joined the Bunbury Motorcycle Club and went racing. Not very well but I did enjoy battering my young self on the Shrublands Park circuit once or twice a month. It was those early days of riding, racing and competing in enduros that shaped my motorcycle world. A world I love sharing with you people.
